Pablo Toral is associate professor of international relations and environmental studies at Beloit College. Martin. London: Ashgate, 2005) and *The Reconquest of the New World. Multinational Enterprises and Spain's Direct Investment in Latin America* (London: Ashgate, 2001). Before graduate school he worked as a journalist in the UK, US, Spain and Latin America.
