Greece 2025 Trip Details

What to expect: Explore the ruins and legends of ancient Greece with a Classical

archaeologist and the provost of Coe College. In addition to archaeological sites, the trip

will include numerous famous museums in Greece, private tours of sites and collections

not available to most of the public, shopping opportunities, free time to explore, and of

course memorable Mediterranean dining!

This unique alumni trip to Greece will start in the city of Athens. We will see the iconic

Parthenon of Athens and the tucked away shops of the Plaka. Sit in the theater of

Dionysos where the plays of Euripides and Sophocles were performed and walk

through the Agora, where the roots of democracy were born. We will take a day trip to

Mt. Parnassos and the ancient oracular shrine of Apollo at Delphi.

As no visit to Greece is complete without seeing its islands, we will travel to the island of

Santorini, or ancient Thira, to visit the famed wineries and the Bronze Age site of

Akrotiri, buried in a volcanic eruption thousands of years ago.

Then the trip will head south into the Peloponnese as we base in the quiet seaside

village of Nafplio known for its Venetian architecture. We will visit the site of Corinth

known for its famous temple of Apollo and the visit of St. Paul to the site during the

Roman period. This tour will visit sites in this area where Dr. Ziskowski is actively

working. Walk under the Lion Gate at the Bronze citadel of Mycenae, where

Agamemnon of the Homeric epics supposedly ruled. And stand in the fourth century BC

theater of Epidaurus, where productions of Greek plays are still performed each

summer.

We will wrap up each day by watching the sun set from world famous views while

staying in upscale hotels and dining nightly on fresh seafood and wine.

Dates: October 11-22, 2025

Locations: 11 nights in Greece (5 in Athens, 2 on Santorini, 4 in Nafplio)

Cost: \$8500 (single occupancy) or \$8000 (double occupancy) includes:

- All accommodations in upscale hotels (11 nights)
- All transportation within Greece (buses, flight to Santorini)
- Museum and site entrance fees
- All breakfasts, most lunches, and at least 6 dinners
- Donation to the Coe's field school and archaeological work*
 - *\$2,000 of your trip fee directly supports the Coe College Archaeological Field School and is therefore a tax-deductible contribution according to the Internal Revenue Service. Your donation will go directly to the ongoing support of the general operations of the project and the hands-on field school for students. The field school is an experiential course that brings Coe students to train, work on archaeological sites in Greece and participate in field trips to important archaeological and historical sites.

- Airfare to and from Greece is **NOT** included; we will meet in Athens at the hotel.
- Greece is a rugged country. Participants must be able to walk up steps and steep slopes in a warm climate.

Day 1 (Sat, Oct. 11): Arrive in Athens by 4pm (you must depart on the 10th) (Night: Athens)

Day 2 (Sun, Oct. 12): Athens: Acropolis and Acropolis Museum (Night: Athens)

Day 3 (Mon, Oct. 13): Ancient Agora/Numismatic Museum (Night: Athens)

Day 4 (Tue, Oct. 14): Athens: National Museum/private research institute tour (Night: Athens)

Day 5 (Wed, Oct. 15): Day trip to Delphi (Night: Athens)

Day 6 (Thu, Oct. 16): Fly to Santorini, visit prehistoric museum (Night:Santorini)

Day 7 (Fri, Oct. 17): Santorini (winery, Akrotiri) (Night: Santorini)

Day 8 (Sat, Oct. 18): Fly to Athens, bus to Nafplio, Palamidi Castle (Night: Nafplio)

Day 9 (Sun, Oct. 19): Mycenae, Nafplio afternoon (Night: Nafplio)

Day 10 (Mon, Oct. 20): Corinth and sites in region (Night: Nafplio)

Day 11 (Tue, Oct. 21): Theater of Epidaurus, Nafplio afternoon (Night: Nafplio)
